A family-friendly afternoon celebrating Bungay's folklore through storytelling, music and drama. The Carnival is one of the main festival events and a chance to come and enjoy our unique heritage and local folklore. Bring your demon cards with you so that you can banish all your fears and worries for another year, with the ritualistic and symbolic 'burning' of the Black Shuck effigy.
